## BREAK-UP OF WEIGHTAGE FOR THE GRAND TOTAL

The Promotion Policy for class XI will be based on the Grand Total (G.T), FOR EACH SUBJECT , which will include assessments, half-yearly examination and final examination.

- $20 \%$ weightage of two best assessments out of three
- $20 \%$ weightage of half-yearly examination
- $60 \%$ weightage of final examination.


## PROMOTION CRITERIA FOR CLASS XI STUDENTS

- Minimum 33\% marks in each subject to be declared as 'PASS'.
- It is mandatory to pass separately in Both - theory as well as practicals
- If a student fails to score $33 \%$ marks in more than two subjects, he/she will have to repeat the class.
- If a student fails to score $33 \%$ marks in any one subject ( As per CBSE Board ), he/she will have to appear for a re-exam. ( School relaxes it to two subjects )
- In case a student fails to score $33 \%$ marks in the re-exam, he/she will have to essentially repeat the class. It is mandatory to pass in one / two Retest Exam(s), the child has appeared for.
